GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS

HRVHS is returning to a school year organized into two 18-week semesters from three 12-week trimesters. Permanent grades are transcripted at the end of each semester. Classes are taken on an 8-period alternating block schedule; the majority of the students take 8 classes per year. Each passing course earns 0.5 credit per semester. During their high school career, students have access to a wide range of learning experiences, including Advanced Placement courses, Honors courses, and College Now courses. All learning experiences are academically rigorous and intended to prepare students for success in college, career, and citizenship.

SCHOOL DEMOGRAPHICS

Hood River Valley High School is a four-year, comprehensive 5A school serving approximately 1300 students, grades 9-12. The school is accredited through the Northwest Association of Schools and Colleges.

The Class of 2023 consisted of 306 students, 64% of these students enrolled in post-secondary schooling: 45% enrolled in a four-year university, 19% enrolled in a two-year college, and <1% military. HRVHS on-time graduation rate is 91%; the state graduation rate is 81%.
