
Hood River County School District (HRCSD) is actively preparing for the start of the school year in Comprehensive Distance Learning (CDL). Staff nor students will be on campus for instruction this fall.

Over the summer, HRCSD established structures to ensure it is providing rigorous, meaningful instruction to all students and maintain important connections while keeping everyone safe and healthy. Since HRCSD is beginning the school year with CDL, it anticipates a reduction in substitute workforce needs. Once staff and students are able to return to buildings on campus, HRCSD anticipates the need to return.

HRCSD appreciates the tremendous service that substitutes provide schools within Hood River County. As the school district assesses the county's health status and the possibility of returning to buildings on campus, it will keep substitutes informed of any changes and transition plans. Prior to returning to onsite, HRCSD will host its annual substitute inservice day (tentatively, a date in November).
