




Key To Quality One: Clear Purpose

Types of Assessments

- Formative—assesses a student's performance during instruction and usually occurs regularly through out the instruction process
- $\bullet \ \ Summative \hbox{--measures a student's achievement at the end of instruction.}$
- Benchmark/Interim- evaluates student performance at periodic intervals, frequently at the end of a grading period (trimester or quarter, fall, winter, spring--can predict student performance on end of year summative tests
- Screener- covers a broad range, primary purpose it to predict need for additional support
 - purpose it to predict
- Progress Monitoring-used to monitor and assess student's progress toward goals, checks in on learning
- Common Formative Assessment-assessment for learning used by a a group of collaborating teachers to measure students' achievement on agreed-upon knowledge and skills using the same administration and scoring
- Common Summative Assessment-assessment of learning used by a a group of collaborating teachers to measure students' achievement on agreed-upon knowledge and skills using the same administration and scoring







- > Must log in with SBAC login and password (which is different than OAKS/TIDE login)


