

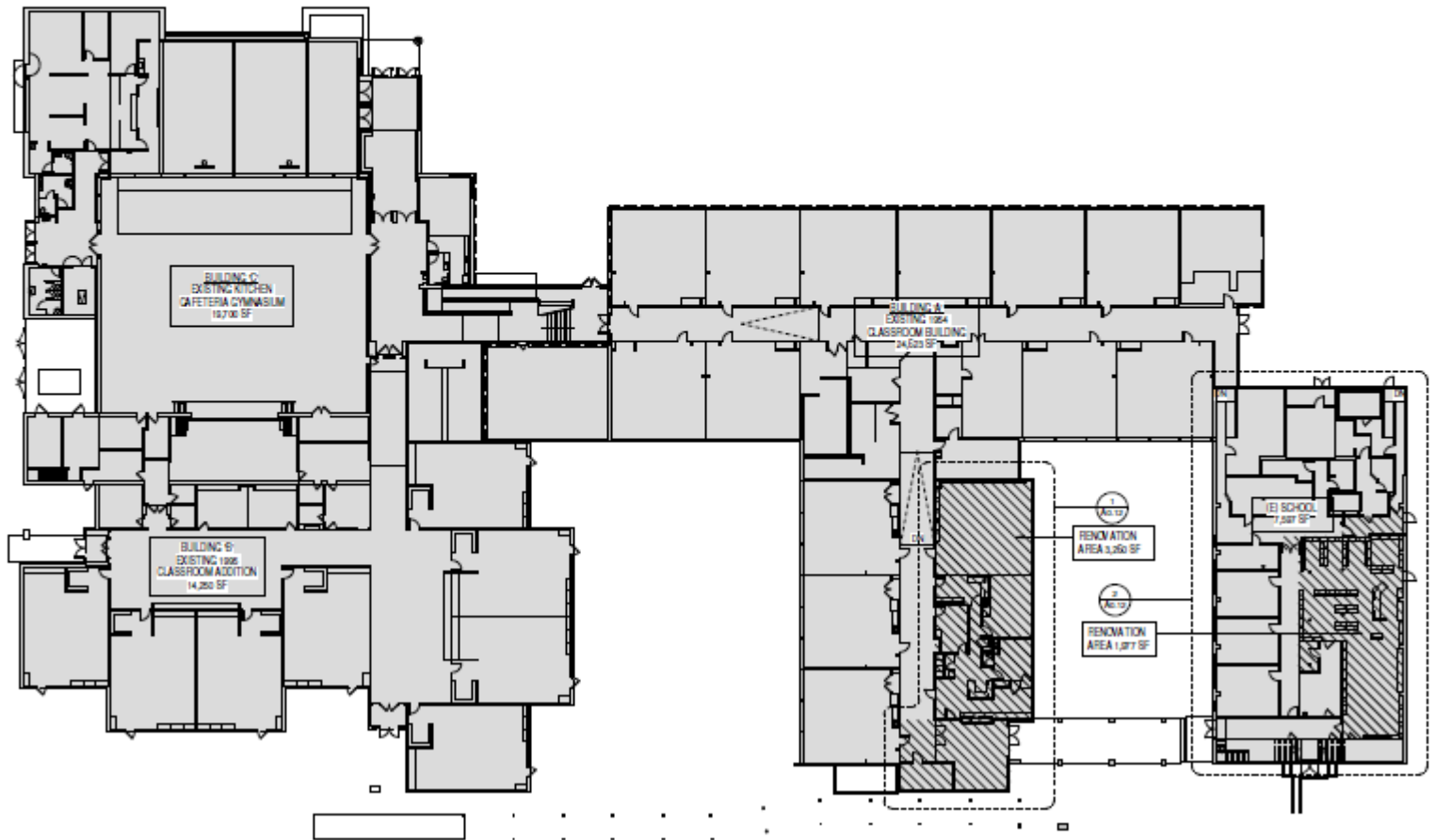

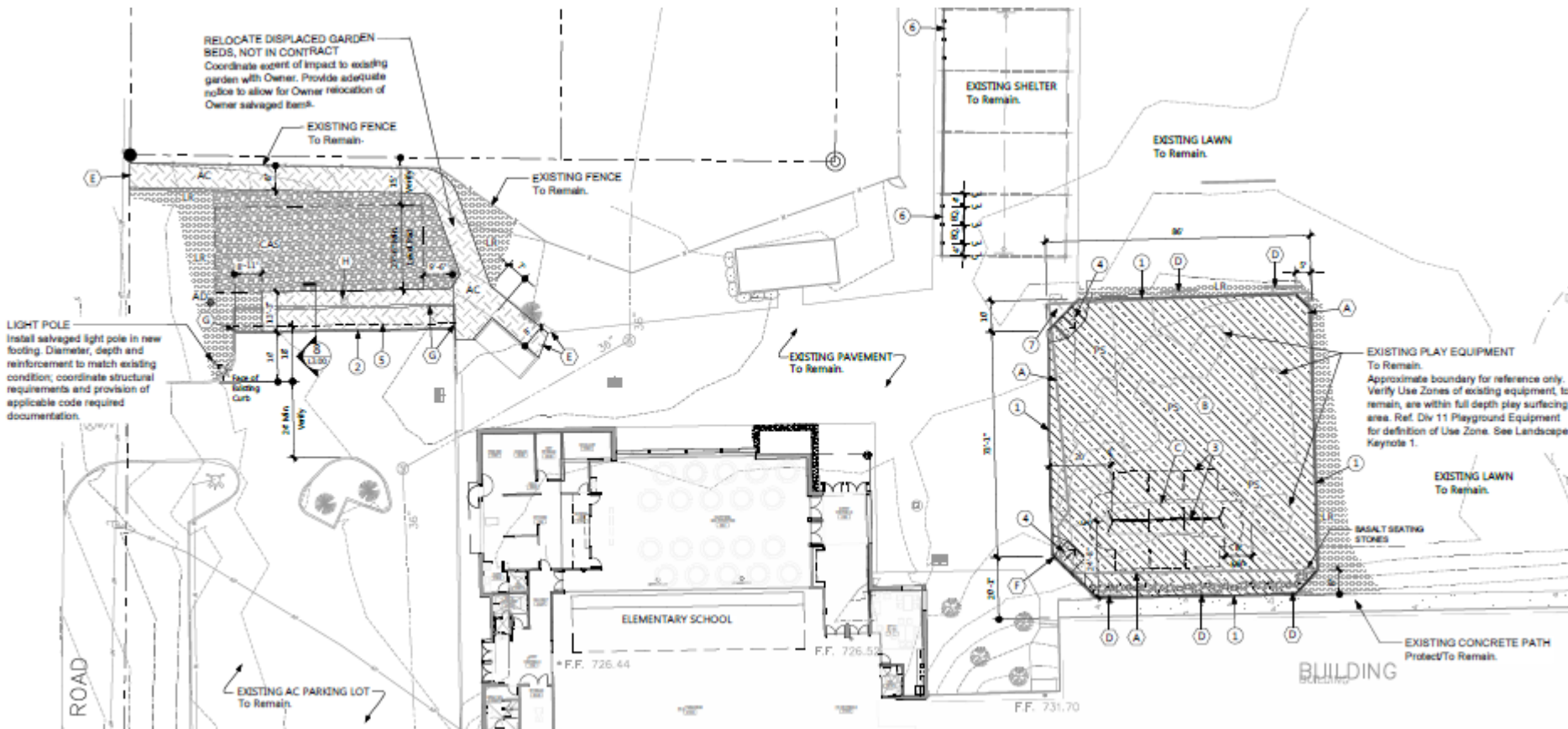


Mid Valley Elementary School



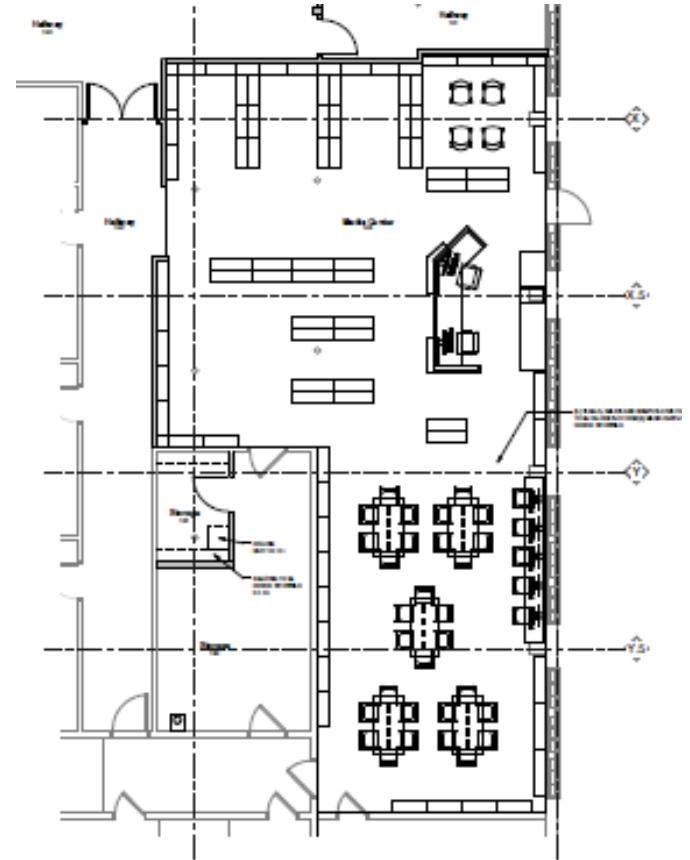
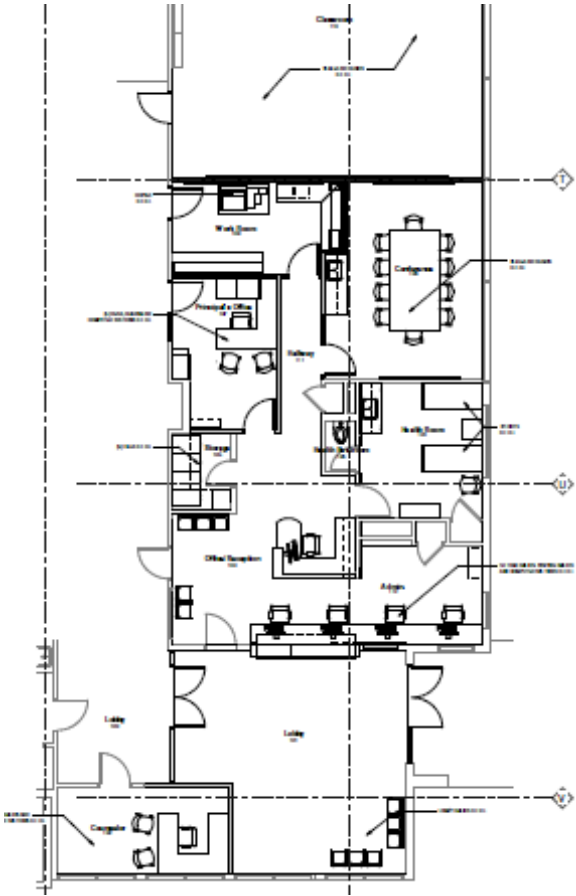

Twelve schools, eight emergency facilities to receive \$35 million in grants from Business Oregon

The state's attempts at building seismic resiliency continue with a new round of funding to upgrade schools and fire stations.

Business Oregon is offering \$35 million in grants to 12 schools and eight emergency service organizations to help shore up their structures in preparation for earthquakes.

Schools and Emergency Services Buildings will be Safer with New Seismic Funding from Business Oregon

Schools and emergency services buildings across the state will soon be safer for their occupants due to the latest round of seismic rehabilitation grants from Business Oregon. Twelve schools and eight emergency service organizations will receive \$35 million in grants to shore up their structures in preparation for impending earthquakes.

"Building a more resilient Oregon is a top priority, and we must continue our critical, ongoing efforts to bolster our schools and key emergency and community centers throughout the state," Governor Kate Brown said. "By working together to leverage local, state, and federal resources, we can create safer communities that will be better prepared and ready to recover more quickly from a major disaster or catastrophic Cascadia earthquake."

The Seismic Rehabilitation Grant Program is a state of Oregon competitive grant program that provides funding for the seismic rehabilitation of critical public buildings, particularly public schools and emergency services facilities. It is one of the infrastructure programs Business Oregon administers to help develop livable and prosperous communities in addition to business development services and programs.

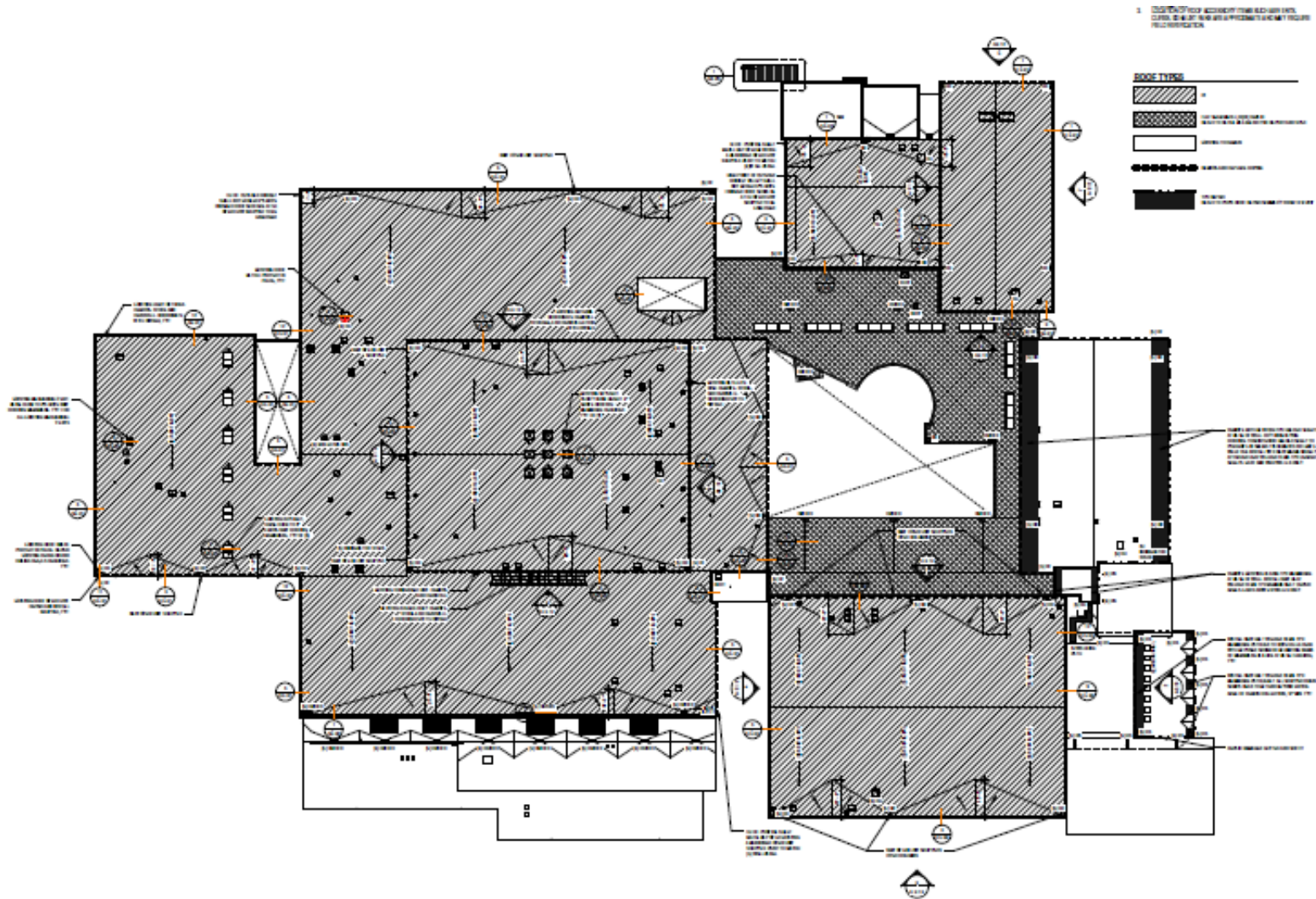

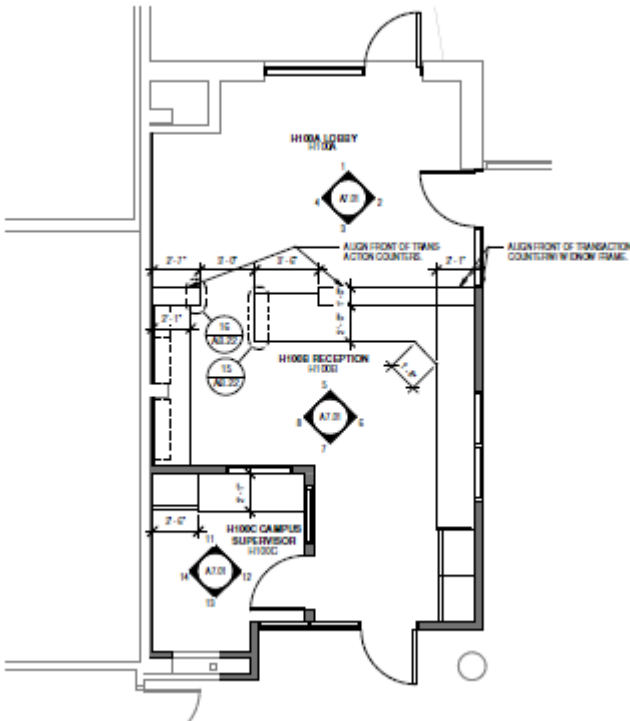
